- Look at the flag. What colors can you find?
- What shapes can you find?
- How is this flag different than the American flag? How is it the same?
- Pretend you are the flag! Move your body like the flag on a nice day, and then on a windy day.



Before and After Your Visit:

- Take a walk around your neighborhood. How many flags can you find? Encourage your child to name the colors in the flags.
- What flags are important to your family? The artist named this flag *Untitled (African-American Flag)*. Share with your child that flags often stand for a country or a group of people. At the library, find pictures of flags from around the world.
