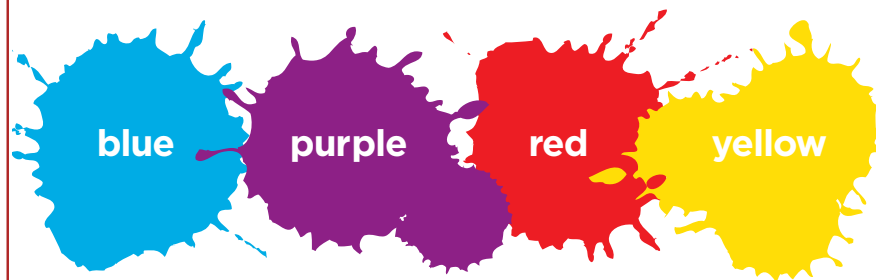

Do-at-Home:

**Make a Colorful Collage!**

Help your child sort the colorful scraps into separate piles by color.

**You'll need:**

- Colorful scraps of magazines, junk mail or old clothing
- A piece of paper or cardboard
- Glue

Have your child glue the materials onto a piece of cardboard or paper. Use one or multiple colors. Let your child choose where to glue each scrap.

*Gluing on paper helps your child develop the coordination necessary for learning to write.*
